More than any individual company, university or politician, the Avalon Airshow places Geelong at the centre of the military industrial complex.

By the coast of Corio Bay on Wathawurrung country, Geelong is the second largest city in Victoria.

Geelong has long been a major manufacturing and port centre for Victoria.

Ford had been a major employer in Geelong since the mid 1900s, but with Australia's entry into many free trade agreements in pursuit of mineral and agricultural exports, it signed away ts rights under international law to continue to support local manufacturing industries.

Except for one: the military industry.

Geelong is now seeking to become a major producer of military equipment to replace the loss of vehicle manufacturing.

As the City of Greater Geelong puts it in its own advertising material:

"Geelong offers strong advanced manufacturing and engineering expertise, coupled with cutting edge research offered through Deakin University.

We are a practical and highly efficient investment location for defence-related activity, markets, customers and suppliers."

This move towards military production is already underway with Marand operating out of the old Ford factory in Norlane and companies like Chemring in Lara both providing parts for the global F-35 fleet.

Korean firm Hanwha has commenced construction of an armoured vehicle building facility adjacent to Avalon Airport.

Avalon Airport itself has become a centre of militarisation, with the biennial Airshow now the largest military trade fair in the country.

Meanwhile Deakin University is using its own research facilities to market itself to the military industry.

The local Federal Member is now the Defence Minister... and all systems are go to transform Geelong into a major military hub.



The Australian Government has set itself a target of joining the ranks of the world's top arms exporters.

This policy was introduced by the Liberal Government in 2018 and taken up with gusto by the current ALP one.

A part of the reasoning for this is to rebuild Australia's manufacturing industry which was gutted by the trade laws of the many trade treaties that Australia has become a party to in recent years.

Another part has been the natural tendency of global capital to move towards a war footing to defend and extend its hegemony.

In line with this surge forward, Australia has a series of secrecy laws that make these exports one of the most secretive and opaque arms exports regimes in the world.

The Australian people have no way of finding out what we are selling, where we're selling to and who these weapons are being used on.

We do know that \$13 million of arms exports have been sent to Israel in the last five years.... But what they are is anyone's guess.

We do know however that over 70 Australian companies are involved in manufacturing parts for the F35 Joint Strike Fighter, and that these companies are the sole producer of these parts... for every F35 in the world.


Wherever these F35s are, Australia treats all the parts we make for them as exports to the US, not their end user.

We know that Israel has used their F35 Adair fighters to drop JDAM bombs on Gaza.... boasted about it in fact.

Rather than conjecturing on what may or may not be being sold to Israel, we are listing here the companies in Victoria that we know have made the weapons that are being used to undertake the deliberate and calculated attempt at genocide of Palestinians by Israel and its allies.

This is not an exhaustive list, There are many more arms companies in Melbourne and around the state that are profitting from arms sales to Israel and elsewhere... these are just the ones we know have products being used in the current war crimes taking place in Gaza.

They claim that their Lara factory is "world's most advanced countermeasures manufacturing facility."

In Australia they also produce Naval countermeasures, IED detection devices, ground penetrating radar and electronic warfare systems including the Manpak electronic signal jamming units.

Marand is the main company within the ASDAM Group which provide over 50% of all Australian made parts for the F-35 global fleet.

In Norlane they produce the engine lifts for the F-35 used all over the world.

They also produce the gun turrets and other sub assemblies for Rheinmetall's Boxer combat vehicle and are collaborating with Norway's Kongsberg Gruppen on a Naval Strike Missile.

They are fast becoming a very important part of Australia's arms industry.

The above two companies are the only two in Geelong that we can say with absolutely certainty have made parts which have been used this year in the attmpted genocide in Gaza. The companies below are also a part of Australia's weapons export drive.

Hanwha are a major Korean conglomerate which began life as an expolsive factory in the 1950s and now is active in everything from mining to shopping centres and life insurance... and military production.

In Geelong they are building a huge new factory at Avalon Airport that will build the Army's new Redback tank along with a self propelled Howitzer artillery system. At the launch of this facility in 2022, Richard Cho, Managing Director of Hanwha Defence Australia claimed that it would "help fulfil contracts in other parts of the world and deliver capacity to engage with Five Eyes nations,"
